



Onsite amenities include riverside terrace, fitness center, lounge, valet parking, bike storage, and lobby Starbucks



In 1852, lumber magnate Sylvester Lind built an office building on the corner of Randolph and modern-day Wacker Drive (then known as Market Street). The Lind Block, as it became known, saw its fair share of tragedy and triumph: it withstood not one but two catastrophic fires, and cast a shadow over the riverfront where Mr. Lind would meet escaped enslaved people to offer shelter and transportation for the Underground Railroad. While nearly every other building in the area turned to ash in the Great Chicago Fire of 1871, the Lind Block survived nearly 100 more years before it was torn down and redeveloped into 150 N Wacker. In 2020, it underwent over \$1.4 million in renovations to its tenant lounge, including a custom millwork ceiling, LEED Gold-certified lighting and heating systems, and pandemic-informed design to allow efficient cleaning and sanitation.
